#### EARLY YEARS GAELIC MEDIUM STEM PROJECT

As part of the Education Scotland Enhancing Professional Learning in STEM initiative, e-Sgoil was awarded grant funding to raise Gaelic Medium Early Years practitioner confidence in, and awareness of, STEM and to build on the underlying principles of Realising the Ambition.

This e-Sgoil project was piloted within Comhairle nan Eilean Siar (Western Isles Council) and aims to:

- Develop an online programme of support
- Coach, support and help Early Years Gaelic Medium staff to engage confidently in STEM experiences

#### What was done?

- A survey was produced and used to gather baseline information and to identify CLPL needs
- A 100% response rate was achieved from Comhairle nan Eilean Siar Early Years settings
- The programme that was developed is now being offered to all Early Years settings in Comhairle nan Eilean Siar
- An Early Years Gaelic Medium STEM Microsoft Team group was created, as a space for learning, discussion, professional development and for sharing resources, ideas and activities
- Gaelic specific links and relevant CLPL opportunities were also shared through the group
- Early Years Gaelic Medium settings requested STEM activities for a range of topics
   e.g. Outdoor Learning, Space, Birds, Under the Sea
- A workshop on Outdoor Learning, was delivered to a cluster of Early Years practitioners with further sessions planned
- Early Years practitioners who have taken part in the workshops, have rated all aspects of the CLPL opportunities, highly

# **Senior Phase Study Support**

e-Sgoil's Study Support evening webinars are now in full swing, with a total of fifty different webinars up and running each week during term time. The number of youngsters registering continues to climb, with lots of people coming onboard just now in the run up to prelims. We currently have 2946 learners registered with a total of 11.6 thousand individual webinar signups. There's still plenty of room, though, because the webinars take place on Microsoft Teams through Glow, so we're able to accommodate hundreds on a call for some of the most popular subjects.

English, Maths, Sciences and Social Subjects are all represented in our timetable, as well as a range of Languages (including Gaelic for learners and fluent speakers), PE, a suite of Business Studies webinars, Music and Art and Design, to name but a few. We cater for a range of levels from N4, through N5 and H to AH. Click on our timetable graphic below for details of the full programme.



We ask participants to evaluate their experience termly, and we're delighted to report that young people have recently rated the 'overall quality of webinar experience' at 4.5 out of 5. This is a great endorsement, and testimony to the commitment of the e-Sgoil Study Support team. Participants enjoy the sense of an online learning community, and the positive relationships that develop between learners and teachers as the year progresses. We also offer a 'Your Questions' channel, where youngsters can post questions about revision or their work through the week between webinar times. 'Your Questions' is monitored, and suggestions and tips are provided by specialist teaching staff.

Study Support is freely available to all senior phase learners via Glow, including for young people whose Local Authority doesn't routinely use Glow - we can provide clear support for easy access.

The programme continues to strike a chord across the country, with teachers from 29 out of Scotland's 32 local authority areas having registered for either provision for their learners, or CLPL for themselves, so far this year.

One highlight from this term was a partnership with National Galleries of Scotland, who arranged for guest artists to run Experimental Drawing sessions across two evenings with Senior Phase learners considering applying to art school. This was the first opportunity for learners themselves to register and join DYW Live sessions. The young artists' work will be showcased in a digital display in the Scottish National Gallery next year. Having received great feedback from learners and the teachers supporting them, we hope to expand this model to other areas of skills development.

As this newsletter goes to press, DYW Live is also supporting an innovative online pilot, with learners from 7 schools in the Scottish Borders aiming to achieve a SCQF Level 4/5 Work Placement with NHS Borders. If successful, DYW Live intends to widen this type of work placement offer to learners across the country, with a variety of job sectors to choose from. Watch this space...!

In the meantime, we hope that you and your learners can join us after a well-earned Christmas break for some of the great range of high quality, free, work-related learning on offer. Among Term 3's highlights will be the massively popular Talk to a Farmer series, which will run from 6-10th February this session.

#### NATIONAL 5 & HIGHER COURSES 2022-23

The number of people studying Gaelic at Advanced Higher, Higher and Nat 5 levels through e-Sgoil continues to rise. Currently there are over 140 individuals from across Scotland involved in such classes. The vast majority are adults who find that this flexible delivery approach suits their circumstances.

Some of them are teachers or people working in education who are interested in introducing Gaelic as a 1+2 language option in their own schools and local authorities.

Pupils whose schools do not provide Gaelic or who aren't able to take Gaelic in school column structures have an alternative option through the e-Sgoil offer.

Those studying these courses with e-Sgoil come from the length and breadth of Scotland.





# NATIONAL 5 & HIGHER COURSES 2023-24

Learn Gaelic, Scotland's oldest National Language, online with other students from across Scotland via e-Sgoil.

Notes of interest and provisional registration are now sought from schools and learners for N5 & Higher Gaelic classes which are offered free of charge. These will begin in August 2023.

# GLPS GAELIC LANGUAGE IN THE PRIMARY SCHOOL

From January 2023, e-Sgoil will launch GLPS sessions to support schools with their L2 and L3 development as part of their 1 + 2 delivery.

This offer will give P5 - 7 pupils the chance to learn Gaelic with a Gaelic speaking teacher using Microsoft Teams. The timing and frequency of the sessions can be flexible, to suit the needs of your pupils.

# Supply teaching across the nation

One of the original reasons for e-Sgoil coming into being was to provide learners with the opportunity to continue with their studies in situations where specialist staff were unavailable in their own schools. These situations can occur for a variety of reasons including staff absence, maternity leave, illness or when learners transfer into a school that does not currently offer all of their preferred curriculum.


Pupils quickly adjust to the new way of being taught and are very appreciative of the opportunity to continue their learning in this way. Pupil feedback is very positive and one pupil said 'it is great being able to access a course that would not otherwise be available in our school'

e-Sgoil supply staff are ready and willing to deliver learning across the country. Currently, e-Sgoil staff are delivering sessions in Gaelic, Maths, German, History, Modern Studies, Business Studies, Administration, English and Graphic Communication. Learners from BGE to Advanced Higher level are accessing courses they might not otherwise be able to take part in.

As part of the listening phase of the National Discussion on Education, e-Sgoil delivered live, interactive sessions to schools across Scotland.

These national broadcasts took place between 16th & 25th November and saw an estimated 26,000 learners take part. The live sessions were designed to start the process of getting young people thinking about school and education so that they could then engage in the main National Discussion process.

Presenters Tom Webster & Gavin Oattes were joined by BSL interpreter Sabine Zielinska for non-stop, action packed sessions which allowed young people to have their say and share their hopes & ideas for the future.

In addition to the main sessions, a number of Spotlight sessions were also scheduled. These focussed on a range of different learner groups, themes and questions allowing young people to really concentrate on one group or one element.





I was attracted to apply to e-Sgoil for several reasons. I was also extremely interested in developing skills in on-line teaching.
