# Introduction & General Information

Thank you for your interest in the Gaelic (Learners) course with e-Sgoil, in partnership with UHI North, West and Hebrides.

These courses, which run at National 4, National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher, aim to offer students the chance to gain a recognised qualification in Gaelic and to allow for progression from previous learning.

Please note, current school pupils in a Scottish secondary school may find that the offer during the school day is more appropriate

The aim of the course is to prepare students for National Qualification exams and as such, will focus on the necessary structures and vocabulary to be successful in the exam.

Teaching involves live, interactive lessons using MS Teams and that attendance and active participation in these sessions is essential.

There is also a requirement for independent study and homework assignments which must be completed along with attendance at live sessions.

Individual feedback may not be given on every piece of work. Generic feedback and common errors will be discussed routinely and more personalised feedback will be weighted towards the end of the course.

You must join the course using suitable and reliable IT. Ideally this will be a desktop or laptop computer with camera and headset (headphone with microphone). Phones are not suitable.

You will not be given access to the MS Teams learning environment until the course fees are paid and UHI NWH registration is complete

The course fee for this has been set by our college partner UHI as £355, which is the amount agreed by their board for all NQ courses offered through the college.

Places are limited and the deadline for confirming your application for this course is midnight on Sunday 15th June. We aim to offer places to successful applicants by w/b 30th June.



Official course registration and course fee payment must be completed before the start date of the course, or your place will be withdrawn.

Entry to course is by application, including a short assessment which should take up to 60 minutes. This will ensure you are offered a place on the most appropriate course. You will find a link to the application form at the bottom of each course page.

The assessment as part of the application will allow e-Sgoil teaching staff to best place you on the most appropriate course for your prior learning experience

The courses will run w/b 25th August 2025 - w/b 23rd March 2026. Classes will be off over the Christmas period and therefore there will be no classes w/b 22nd December or w/b 29th December 2025. Classes will resume from w/b 5th January 2026.

Key dates for the course will be shared with students during the induction.

# N4 Gaelic (Learners)

## Who is this course for?

Complete beginners of the language or those with some basic words or phrases.

## When will this course run?

Tuesdays 6pm – 7.30pm (live lesson)

## What are the course fees?

A fee of £355 is payable to our UHI partners before the course begins.

## When will the course start and end?

The courses will run w/b 25th August 2025 - w/b 23rd March 2026.

Classes will be off over the Christmas period and therefore there will be no classes w/b 22nd December or w/b 29<sup>th</sup> December 2025.

Classes will resume from w/b 5th January 2026.

## What is the time commitment?

You will attend live sessions every week with a break for Christmas. You will be expected to undertake homework and revision tasks and independent study on top of your 1.5 hours of live lessons per week.

You should expect to spend around a total of 6 hours per week, although this will vary across the year due to the demands of the course.

# N5 Gaelic (Learners)

## Who is this course for?

People with an interest in Gaelic Language and Culture who have a basic understanding of the language. This might include learning with SpeakGaelic, Duolingo or a course with another provider.

It is not possible to join this course as a beginner and, subject to viability, beginners will be offered a place on the National 4 course.

## When will this course run?

Live lessons will run on:

Tuesday: 7:45pm - 9:30pm

In addition, you will attend a conversation class:

Monday: 6:30pm - 7:30pm

## What are the course fees?

A fee of £355 is payable to our UHI partners before the course begins.

## When will the course start and end?

The course will run from w/b 25th August 2025 until w/b 23rd March 2026.

There will be revision sessions in the month of April.

SQA exams will take place in May 2026 with the speaking exam taking place in February/March 2026.

## What is the time commitment?

You will attend live sessions every week with a break for Christmas. You will be expected to undertake homework and revision tasks and independent study on top of your 2 hours and 45 minutes of live sessions per week.

The demands of independent study and homework will vary across the year with heavier workload expected after the Christmas break.

The assessment as part of the application will allow e-Sgoil teaching staff to best place you on the most appropriate course for your prior learning experience.

The live lesson times will vary across the year.
